Moments in LQP History

This edition of the customer newsletter marks the first installment of a new article featuring historic snapshots of stories from Litter Quality Propane's past, since its inception in 1932. The purpose of this article is to both inform and entertain our readers regarding the experience and heritage that comprises LQP. In 1926, Robert E. Litter (21), Litter Quality Propane's founder, worked as store manager for J.C. Penney's retail location in Chillicothe, OH. The same year, Robert E. received a letter from James Cash Penney, the retailing giant's founder, requesting R.E. to travel to New York City to personally meet with him in his office. Robert

E. boarded a train for New York to meet with J.C. to discuss the purpose of his letter. During the meeting in his office, J.C. praised Robert E. for his effectiveness as a store manager and his tremendous work ethic. Robert E. was relieved to hear those words of praise since the invitation didn't give an explanation for the meeting. As the meeting progressed, J.C. explained J.C. Penney Co.'s plans to expand across the country. Robert E. was offered an executive position within the corporation to help Penney grow the corporation's size. J.C. asked if R.E. was interested in the position. R.E. responded

by saying that he was very appreciative, but had plans to go into business for himself and declined the offer. J.C. responded by saying, "I'm disappointed, but not surprised. I'm sure that whatever you set your mind to, you'll be a success". The two men shook hands and Robert E. began his quest to start Litter Quality Propane.

Remember... if the tank is at or below 40%, you should think about placing your gas order to prepare for the cold fall and winter months. You may also want to check your heating appliance and make sure that it is clear of any



debris and is working correctly before the heating season is upon us. Check your furnace air filter too. A clean filter will help your furnace work more efficiently.

Cooking with Propane



Ingredients:

1 cup vegetable oil

3 eggs

1 (15 ounce) can pumpkin puree

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

2 1/2 cups white sugar

2 1/2 cups all-purpose flour

1 teaspoon baking soda

1 teaspoon ground nutmeg

1 teaspoon ground allspice

1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1 teaspoon ground cloves

1/4 teaspoon salt

1/4 cup chopped nuts

Directions:

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Grease one 10 inch bundt or tube pan.

2. Cream oil, beaten eggs, pumpkin and vanilla together.

3. Sift the flour, sugar, baking soda,

ground nutmeg, ground allspice, ground cinnamon, ground cloves and salt together. Add the flour mixture to the pumpkin mixture and mix until just combined. If desired, stir in some chopped nuts. Pour batter into the prepared pan.

Bake at 350 degrees F (175 degrees C) for 1 hour or until a toothpick inserted in the middle comes out clean. Let cake cool in pan for 5 minutes then turn out onto a plate and sprinkle with confectioners' sugar.
